4. Absentee voting, by mail and in person (3:20 – 3:30)

- Any **registered Wisconsin voter** is eligible to request an absentee ballot for any reason.
- How to request an absentee ballot:
 - In person, by mail, by email, or online at <u>MyVote.wi.gov</u>
 - Photo ID requirements
 - Completing the ballot/ witness
 - Returning the ballot
- Indefinitely Confined
- Needed: screen reader accessible ADA compliant absentee ballot
- In-person absentee

5. Voter rights (3:30 - 3:45)

Voter Rights

- You have the right to vote privately and independently.
- You have the right to access the polling place, including an accessible route to enter the building.
- You have the right to use an accessible voting machine.
 All polling places are required by law to have an accessible voting machine.
- You have the right to assistance marking your ballot. You may bring someone to assist you or ask a poll worker for assistance. *Note: You cannot receive assistance from your employer or from your union representative*.

- You have the right to ask for reasonable accommodations at the polling place. Some common accommodations might be: a chair to sit on a signature guide a magnifying glass assistance with stating a person's name and address
- If a voter cannot enter the absentee voting location or polling place due to disability, Wis. Stat. § 6.82(1) requires that curbside voting must be available. *Tip: contact your clerk in advance to discuss how to access curbside voting. (number to call, bell to ring, honk horn etc)*

What a Voter should do if they have a problem at polling place or request for accommodation is not honored (See FAQ for reference)
