Are you eligible to vote? The answer is yes, if:

- You are a US Citizen,
- You will be at least 18 y-o on or before Election Day,
- You have lived in Wis. for at least 28 days prior to the election,
- You are not currently serving a sentence (incarceration, parole, probation, or extended supervision) for a felony conviction, **and**
- You have not been determined by a court to be ineligible to vote (e.g. guardianship decision removing the right to vote).

Do you need to register to vote? The answer is yes, if:

- You are a first-time voter,
- You have moved,
- You have changed your name,
- You haven't voted in over 4 years, **and/or**
- You haven't registered since your voting rights have been restored (e.g. after completing a felony sentence).

Voter Eligibility & Registration Determination Flowchart

Registration options:
Do you have a valid Wis. Driver License or State ID card?

Yes

Online Registration:

- Up to 20 days before the election.
- **If you have a valid State of Wis. Driver License or State of Wis. ID card** issued by the Wis. Dept. of Motor Vehicles (DMV) you can register to vote online at myvote.wi.gov.
- To register online, enter your name, date of birth, Driver License or ID number, and an address that matches what is on file with the Wis. DMV. If all fields match, you will be able to register completely online and will not need to send a proof of residence document.
- If all of your information does not match the Wis. DMV information, you will be given the option to print, sign and mail the form (or deliver it to your municipal clerk), You must provide a Proof of Residence document when registering.

Note: A photo ID is **not** required when registering to vote but will be needed to vote by most voters. **See Voter Photo ID Flowchart** for more information.

By mail:

- Up to 20 days before the election.
- Registration forms should be mailed to your municipal clerk.
- You can start you registration form online at myvote.wi.gov .
- Your form must be printed, signed, and mailed or delivered to your municipal clerk.
- You must provide a Proof of Residence document when registering.
- When registering by mail, you can use any of the forms of Proof of Residence except a residential lease.

Municipal Clerk's office:

- You may register in-person in your municipal clerk's office up until the Friday before the election at 5 p.m. or close of business, whichever is later.
- You must always provide a Proof of Residence document when registering to vote.

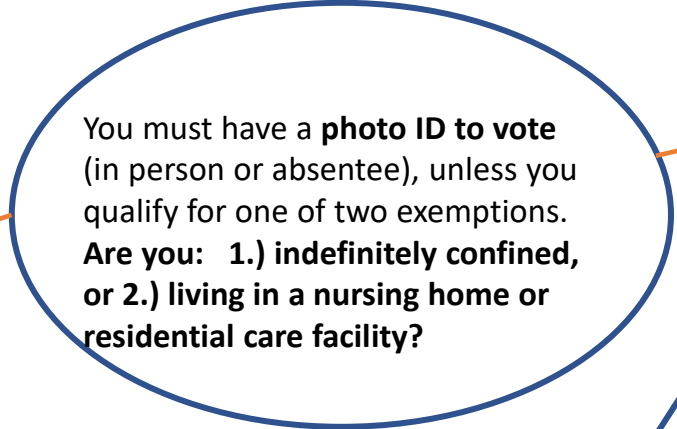
Polling place:

- You may register at the polls on Election Day.
- You must always provide a Proof of Residence document when registering to vote.

Proof of Residence documents include:

- A current and valid Wis. Driver License or State ID card
- A utility bill (must be for the period no earlier than 90 days before registration date)
- An intake document from a residential care facility (i.e. nursing home or group home)
- Bank statement or credit card statement

Yes

If you are **indefinitely confined, you do not have to provide a copy of a photo ID**, instead you may:

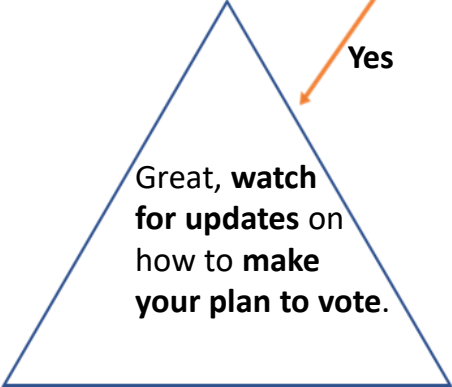
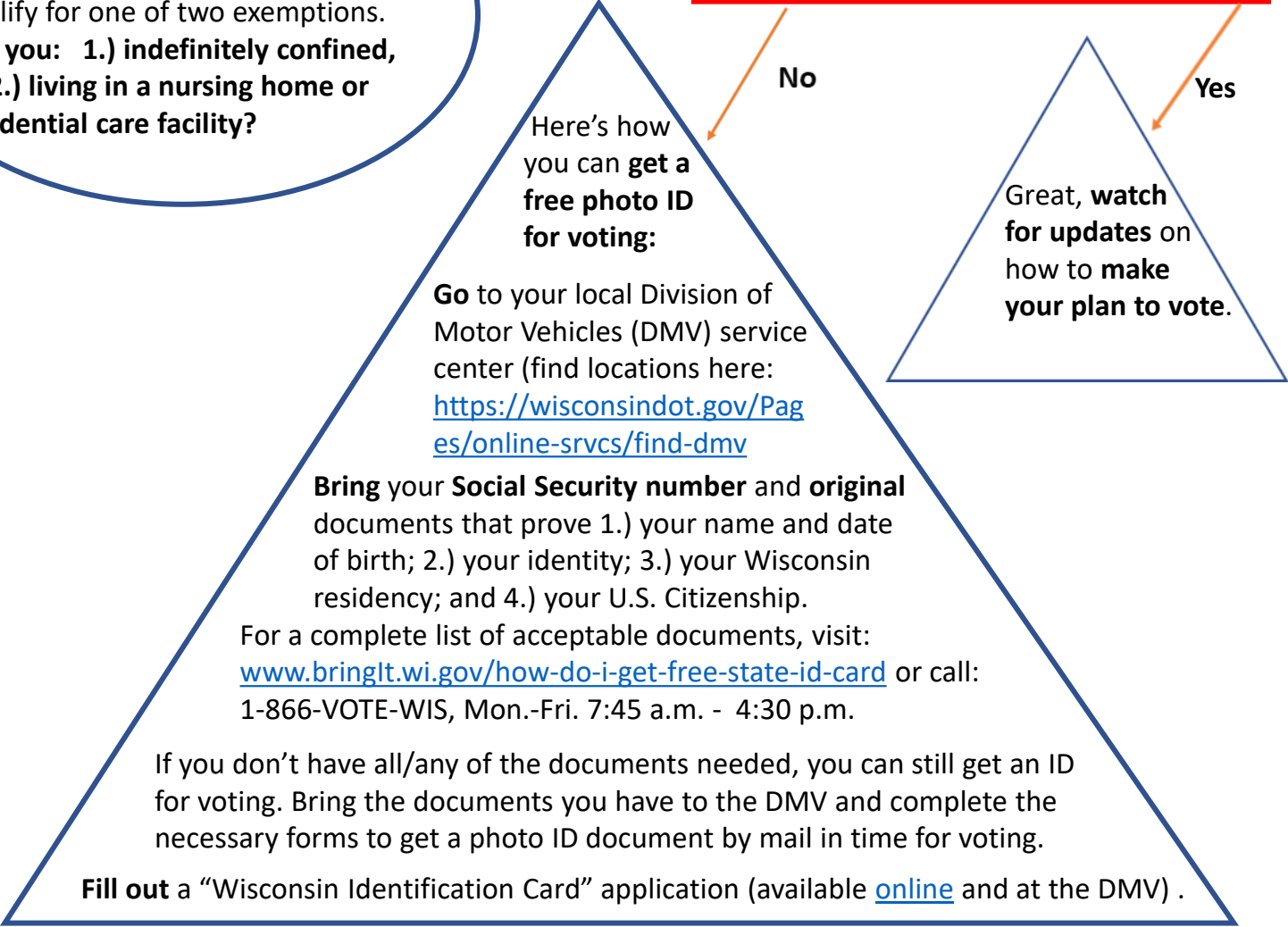
- Indicate on your absentee ballot application form that you are indefinitely confined due to age, illness, or disability
- Sign your absentee ballot envelope, and then have your absentee witness verify your identity by also signing your absentee ballot envelope before you return it.

If you live in a nursing home or residential care facility and do not have an acceptable photo ID, you may:

- Have the two Special Voting Deputies (SVDs) verify your identity by signing your absentee ballot envelope as witnesses, if your nursing home/facility is visited by SVDs.
- Ask an authorized representative of the facility to sign the absentee ballot envelope to verify your identity, if your facility is not visited by SVDs.
