This document has key 2023 election dates and deadlines for the February 21 and April 4 elections.

2023 Spring Elections

Spring Primary: February 21, 2023 Spring Election: April 4, 2023

Offices to be elected include:

State Supreme Court, Court of Appeals Districts 1 and 4, Circuit Courts in various counties, local races depending on where you live, such as County Executive, County Board, Mayor, City Council, Town or Village President and Board, School Board, and a Special Election for Senate District 8.

See <u>MyVote Wisconsin</u> to check your voter registration status, register to vote, and/or request an absentee ballot.

Absentee Voting: January 1 is the first day voters can request absentee ballots for the year. They can request ballots for certain elections or for all elections for the calendar year.

Spring Primary – February 21, 2023

- January 24 Last day to begin acquiring residence to vote in Spring Primary. Voters moving after this date may vote from their prior address.
- January 31 Clerks mail absentee ballots to voters with valid requests on file.
- February 1 Deadline to register to vote by mail or online in the Spring Primary. After this date, voters must register in-person in the municipal clerk's office or at their polling place.
- February 7 In-person early voting can begin.
- February 16 Absentee ballot request deadline for regular and overseas voters.
- February 17 Last day to register to vote in the clerk's office or other designated location before Election Day.

- February 21 Election Day
 - Polls are open from 7 am–8 pm.
 - Voters can register in-person on Election Day.
 - Deadline to return an absentee ballot is 8 pm.
- February 24 Deadline at 4 pm for provisional voters to provide missing information to their clerk.

Spring General Election – April 4

- March 7 Last day to begin acquiring residence to vote in Spring Primary. Voters moving after this date may vote from their prior address.
- March 14 Clerks mail absentee ballots to voters with valid requests on file.
- March 15– Deadline to register to vote by mail or online in the Spring Election. After this date, voters must register in-person in the municipal clerk's office or at their polling place.
- March 21– In-person early voting can begin.
- March 30 Absentee ballot request deadline for regular and overseas voters.
- March 31 Last day to register to vote in the clerk's office or other designated location before Election Day.
- April 4 Election Day
 - Polls are open from 7am–8pm.
 - $\circ~$ Voters can register in-person on Election Day.
 - Deadline to return an absentee ballot is 8 pm.
- April 7 Deadline at 4 pm for provisional voters to provide missing information to their clerk.
