



Voting Rights

You have the right to:

- vote privately and independently.
- access the polling place, including an accessible route to enter the building.
- use an accessible voting machine.
- have help with marking the ballot.
- ask for help or reasonable accommodations at the polling place.

Some reasonable accommodations include:

- a chair to sit on
- a signature guide
- a magnifying glass
- help with stating your name and address
- curbside voting, if you can't enter the polling place because of your disability
- bringing someone to help you
- asking a poll worker for help
